The church does not proselytise, but rather she grows by 'attraction'" to the beauty of God's love.

Evangelisation "does not begin by seeking to convince others, but by bearing witness each day to the love that has watched over us and lifted us back up.

We are the ones who announce the Lord, we do not announce ourselves, nor a political party or an ideology. Put people in contact with Jesus without convincing them. Let the Lord convince them.

CAST THE NET OUT & GO!

For us, we learned that following Jesus is a relationship. Every day he invites us to commune with Him, which requires us to "throw our nets" to align with Him. Following Jesus, comes at the cost of full surrender because it means leaving things behind and letting go of control of what we think is best for us. When we look at Jesus inviting people to know Him, He regularly convicted them in their most vulnerable areas, whether it was to give up their status, possessions, or whatever that was preventing them from fully devoting themselves to Him. By faith, the disciples surrendered despite their uncertainties, and Jesus assured them of what He would do with and through them..

Faith that is not used and practiced is as good as dead. It just sits in the boat collecting spiritual dust. Jesus told the disciples to cast their nets and GO! We have to put our faith into action and believe God for great things! If you want to catch the big things from God, you have to go out to the deep end. You

God has what you need waiting for you if you will step out and go where He is calling you to go.

be the same across the East Brighton Hub Parishes, Priests, Catholic lay staff - none of them are supposed to be just Sacramental assembly lines, where we start with the raw material in order to create "good Catholics" which are spit out at the end - but it can certainly feel that way. So many people to get prepared for baptisms, weddings, Confirmation, etc. So little time and people to help us get them prepared. We get stretched thin, as staff, and then fall back on the classes, videos, etc. that never seem to change anything. Stuck in a cycle which maintains the status quo, we don't know what to do.

Furthermore, we can't just give out the Sacraments incognito or without hope that there is some kind of living faith that will be carried out. So, what are we supposed to do with all of this? How can we change things?

Well, I believe there is a lot we can do and I hope to make a few practical suggestions that can help us shift from seeing Sacramental formation as forms and classes into relationships and conversions. Of course, I can't answer all the issues in one article. But, I do hope this can give us a starting point to launch into something better.

Remember, our goal is conversion of hearts, not just getting folks through the process!
