Jesus' call to renew our baptismal mission

At the very beginning of his public life, Jesus expressed his understanding of the mission he had to carry out. In the synagogue of Nazareth, he applied to himself Isaiah's description of the messianic mission: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.'

In the months that followed, he preached ceaselessly the coming of God's kingdom or reign into our midst. 'I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God to the other cities also; for I was sent for this purpose'

Jesus came to save all people and to call them into God's kingdom. What he did once and for all is now accessible to all people of every age. But there is a sense in which his mission continues. The Church exists to carry on that mission. Through sacrament<u>s</u> and preaching, the Church makes Christ present in today's world as the one who still calls conversion, forgives sin, heals, and proclaims the law of love. The Holy Spirit, who guided Jesus in his earthly ministry, continues to lead the Church in its continuation of his mission. At the end of each Mass, we are sent back into the world, instructed and strengthened for the Christian mission.

Here's our working definition: **Missional Community** is a flexible term to describe a group of Christian disciples who form community with a particular missionary purpose. A common commitment to prayer and living out the Christian faith together are the basis for their mission as a community. Mission can be to a particular place, a particular age group or subculture, or around a particular mark of mission e.g. care for environment, social justice.

More recently we have sought to describe some of the principles of missional community. Missional community is not really a form but what happens when a group of people intentionally set out to share life and ministry together with a common set of values inspired by the gospel.

OUR PRIORITIES:

Christian community that is small enough to enable us to be "one another", to adapt quickly to the changing world around us, to be participative and foster belonging. So, our plan is to build our parish that is <u>Community of communities</u>, where we grow in small groups, sharing our pray life with others.

Christian community that is open: open to the leading of the Spirit, to building the Kingdom in partnership with others, to conversation and dialogue as means of doing mission with others, to discipleship as a journey together into which we invite others as co-learners.

Our mission is the long-term goal that your community aims to achieve.

Our mission is the overarching statement we use to describe what our community does, not how our community does it As a <u>church</u>, we're working on building the church through missional communities. They're a bit like small groups, they're a bit like house churches but aren't really either.

We believe that the primary image the scriptures give us for the church is family, the primary purpose of the church is to make disciples and the mission of the church is to do that all over the world.

Leading people to the chief end of glorifying God and enjoying Him forever will accomplish the types of missional communities we long for our churches to be. Places where the love of God flows freely from those experiencing the love of God given to them freely.


